As part of tornado clean up, the City of Minneapolis is dealing with an increase in tree stumps that are unsecured or have exposed root balls. In addition (and related), abandoned properties are having ongoing problems with volunteer tree growth (where seeds have taken root and are growing where they should not in large numbers). To work with a contractor on clean up of these conditions, we will need the ability to assess for that clean up. These specific conditions -- "nuisance vegetative growth" -- are not currently included on the list of approved assessments in state code.
