To: Council Member Lisa Goodman, Community Development Committee

Subject: Authorization to amend a Contract with Hennepin County and to receive additional MFIP funds for the 18/19 Year Old MFIP program operated by Minneapolis Public Schools.

Recommendation: That the proper city officials be authorized to execute Amendment #1 to contract C-28762 with Hennepin County (HC Agreement # A102287) for the operation of the 18/19 Year Old MFIP Program by Minneapolis Public Schools. The amendment increases the contract by \$138,250 for a new total of \$276,500 and extends the end date of the agreement to December 31, 2011. The dollar amount has already been appropriated into the 2011 budget.

Previous Directives: On January 14, 2011 the Minneapolis City Council authorized City officers to enter into a contract with Hennepin County to receive funds to operate the 18/19 Year Old MFIP Program. (City Contract # C-28762)

Supporting Information

The amendment increases the funding and the period of performance for City contract C-28762 (Hennepin County Agreement #A102287), which covers the operation of the 18/19 Year Old MFIP Program by Minneapolis Public Schools. The increase in funding is necessary to cover the extended time period of the agreement. The Minneapolis Public Schools Teenage Pregnancy and Parenting Program (TAPPP) contracts with METP to provide MFIP Education & Monitoring Services to all 18 and 19 year-olds living in Hennepin County and receiving MFIP. The anticipated outcome is to increase the number of MFIP teens who are in compliance with MFIP obligations and who graduate from high school or earn a GED before their 20th birthday.
