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Population

The Population Chapter in this year's *State of the City* contains new decennial census data. Its primary intent is to present Census 2000 results, often in comparison to earlier years and other geographic areas. Comparative data from past census have been taken from previous *State of the City* issues and from various U.S. Census publications.

In April 2001, the following Census 2000 variables were released: total population by race, population 18 years and over by race, and Hispanic/Latino population.

The *State of the City 2001* presents the most current data on Minneapolis' racial and ethnic, age, and geographic distribution, as well as demographic characteristics of its families, households, and home ownership. Additional census data is scheduled for release concerning demographic, social, economic, and housing characteristic in the spring of 2002.



Total Population and Household Characteristics

According to the Census 2000, Minneapolis' total population grew by nearly four percent or 14, 235 persons since 1990. After decades of population losses, Minneapolis' population was reported at 382,618 in 2000. The 2000 Census data also reported a decline in the number of residents living in family households.

In 2000, there were 162,352 households in Minneapolis compared to 160,682 in 1990 (each occupied housing unit has one household). A total of 364,554 persons lived in households in 2000, an average of 2.25 persons per household. Additionally, in 2000, 54.5 percent of households identified themselves as non-family (only unrelated individuals or a single individual living in an occupied housing unit). Non-family households (83,011) have risen by three percent in proportion to family households (73,939) in 2000.


WHITE AND NON-WHITE POPULATION CHANGE
1950 - 2000





WITH CHILDREN UNDER 18, 2000




FAMILY HOUSEHOLD AND NON-FAMILY HOUSEHOLD

Community Population and Age Distribution

Minneapolis has been divided into 11 communities, consisting of 80 neighborhoods and three industrial areas. Although Minneapolis total population increased by 3.86 percent between 1990 and 2000, it increased or declined to varying degrees within geographic subareas throughout the city. As shown in the following table, five of the 11 communities gained a population of greater than five percent, while three experienced losses between 1990 and 2000.


According to the 2000 Census, Minneapolis experienced a four percent (12,840 persons) decline in the senior population, and a three percent increase in school age and young adults populations. The median age in 2000 is slightly higher by .3 percent since 1990.

The Census 2000 showed an increase in the school age, young adult and middle age population, reversing the 1980-1990 trend in these population groups. Counts for the categories of school age, young adult and middle age populations have increased, but the population categories preschool, adult and senior all declined from 1990 to 2000.

The decrease of the adult (25-44 years old) population was nearly 4,000 between 1990 and 2000. However,

Minneapolis experienced a large increase in the middle age category (25.6 percent or 17,539 persons). The following table details the change in population by age category for the 1980 to 2000 period.

Minneapolis' racial and ethnic diversity continues to climb. The city's minority population has more than doubled since 1980. Minorities increased by 54,016 persons or 68 percent between 1990 and 2000. Racial and ethnic diversity is most predominating in the younger age categories where approximately 40 percent of the child population were children of color in 1990. By 2000, over 70 percent of children in public school were children of color.

Although the city's total population hardly changed during the 1980s, significant shifts occurred within specific racial and ethnic populations. Between 1990 and 2000, the city's white population declined by 39,781 or 13.8 percent. This decline, while significant, is not near the level of non-minority population loss that occurred between 1970 and 1980, when the white population declined by 82,582. Growth in the city's minority population has accelerated. Between 1970 and 1980 the city's minority population increased by 19,133 persons; the increase in the city's minority population between 1980 and 1990 was 32,296 persons, and 54,016 persons between 1990 and 2000.

The 2000 Census allowed people to identify themselves by more than one race. In Minneapolis 16,694 persons identified themselves by two or more races, while 15,798 persons or 4.1 percent identified themselves as some other race. The black/African American (68,818) is the largest minority group in Minneapolis. Forty percent of Minnesota's black/African American population resides in Minneapolis, followed by 20 percent of the Hispanic population, 15 percent of the American Indian/Alaska Native, and 16 percent Asian/Native Hawaiian/other Pacific Islander. The second largest minority group in Minneapolis is the Asian/Native Hawaiian/other Pacific Islander at 23,744 persons in 2000.

In 2000, the American Indian/Alaska Native population decreased by 3,957 or 32.1 percent. The decline is due to out-of-state migration and significant shift to tribal reservations. Nationally, the Twin Cities dropped from 8th to 16th largest among urban Indian populations. Asian/Native Hawaiian/other Pacific Islander population increased by a 51 percent growth. Black/African American population grew by 44 percent. Hispanic population soared at 269 percent. Minneapolis' total non-white population increased by 68 percent.

The Minneapolis Public School system had a population of 49,152 students at the beginning of the 2000-2001 school year. The racial composition of students is 21,938 students or 44.63 percent black; 13,288 students or 27.03 percent white; 7,215 students or 14.68 percent Asian; 4,508 or 9.17 percent Hispanic; and 2,203 students or 4.48 percent American Indian. The schools also reported that in 2000 the most prevalent languages spoken by participants in the English Language Learners program were Hmong, Spanish, and Somali.

The percent of the population in each age bracket varies by race and ethnicity, according to the 2000 Census. Each of the ethnic population groups has a significant proportion of the city's children. The average percentage of children 17 years old or less (school age and pre-school) was greater than 30 percent for people of color. The white population under 17 years old represented only 13.37 percent of the total white population. On the other end of the age spectrum, the white population has a higher percentage of older people than the other racial or ethnic classifications. Seniors 65 years old and over represented 12.3 percent of the white population. People of color, in the 65 years and over category, represent less than 4 percent on average.






Racial and Ethnic Composition by Community and Neighborhood

Calhoun-Isles Community. Although, the overall increase in population was relatively small at .35 percent, the Calhoun Isles community experienced a number of significant changes between 1990 and 2000. During this period, the white population declined by 864 or 3 percent, while the non-white population rose significantly. Asian/Native Hawaiian/other Pacific Islander experienced the largest growth at 49 percent, while American Indian/ Alaska Native population decreased by 31 percent. Calhoun-Isles Hispanic/Latino population rose by 55 percent.

Camden Community. The 2000 Census reported a 10 percent population increase. During the same period the racial and ethnic composition of the community changed considerably. The white population declined by 35 percent or 8,841 persons. The Asian/Native Hawaiian/other Pacific Islander population experienced the largest increase at 660 percent, followed by the black/African American with an increase of 290 percent. This represents the largest Asian/Native Hawaiian/other Pacific Islander population increase of Minneapolis' 11 communities. The Hispanic/Latino population increased by 118 percent.

Central Community. Population increases of non-whites contributed largely to the 14 percent growth experienced by the Central community. The most noticeable increases were among the black/African American population up 64 percent and the Asian/Native Hawaiian/other Pacific Islander up 76 percent. As in most other communities, the American Indian/Alaska Native population declined by 14 percent since 1990. The white population also declined by 4.43 percent. The Hispanic/Latino population grew by 119 percent.

Longfellow Community. Longfellow is one of three communities to experience an overall population decline (three percent) in 2000. Longfellow experienced a large percent change in black/African American population. The Census 2000 showed a 125.38 percent increase or 1,665 black/African American persons in Longfellow. The Hispanic/Latino population increased 129.01 percent or 805 persons. The white population declined by 4,388 persons or 17.12 percent and the American Indian/Alaska Native declined by 39 persons or 5.13 percent.

Near North Community. There was a slight increase of two percent in the Near North community total population during the past decade. Near-North experienced large declines in both white and American Indian/Alaska Native populations. Whites in the areas decreased from 13,592 in 1990 to 6,990 in 2000. American Indians/Alaska Natives decreased 59 percent or 561 persons. Black/African Americans population gained 3,419 or 21 percent in 2000. The Hispanic/

Latino population realized the largest growth at 108.01 percent change or 957 persons since 1990, along with Asian/Native Hawaiian/other Pacific Islander at 55 percent change or 2,121 persons.

Nokomis Community. The Nokomis community experienced a total population decline of 3.23 percent or 1,244 persons. All racial groups except whites experienced a steady increase in population. White population declined by 11 percent or 3,841 persons. Of the non-white population, Asian/Native Hawaiian/other Pacific Islander realized the largest population gain (58 percent or 386 persons) in this area. The Hispanic/Latino population increased by 181 percent or 1,004 persons.

Northeast Community. Although the total population of the Northeast community only increased by one percent, the composition of the area changed markedly. The white population declined by 4,560 persons or 13 percent. At the same time, the black/African American population sharply increased by 351 percent. The Asian/Native Hawaiian/other Pacific Islander population increased by 104 percent and the Hispanic/Latino population rose by 337 percent. As in most other areas of the city, the American Indian/Alaska Native population dropped by 14 percent.

Phillips Community. During the past decade, the Phillips community grew by 14.83 percent or 2,558 persons. This represents the largest total population increase of the city's 11 communities. The increase is largely associated with the black/African American population growth by 58 percent or 2,148 persons, and the Hispanic/Latino population increase of 557 percent or 3,718 persons. The American Indian/Alaska Native population dropped considerably to 43 percent or 1,805 persons and the Asian/Native Hawaiian/other Pacific Islander population also declined in the Phillips community. Phillips and Southwest were the only Minneapolis communities that experienced a decline in the Asian/Native Hawaiian/other Pacific Islander population.

Powderhorn Community. During the period from 1990 to 2000, the Powderhorn community was one of four Minneapolis communities that experienced a population increase of 10 percent or greater. Over the same period, the Powderhorn white population decreased by 12 percent or 3,865 persons. The growth of the community can be attributed to an increase in the non-white population with the exception of the American Indian/Alaska Native population, which experienced a decline of 35 percent. The most significant changes can be seen in the Hispanic/Latino population that increased by 9,404 persons or 602 percent.

Southwest Community. During the past ten-years, the Southwest community changed significantly in both population and composition. The community experienced an overall decline in population of 4 percent

attributed largely to a decrease in the white population of 3,556 persons. During the same period, the non-white population changed significantly with an increase in the black/African American population of 13 percent or 276 persons and more notably an increase in the Hispanic/Latino populations by 155 percent or 895 persons. Within the community, the American Indian/Alaska Native and the Asian/Native Hawaiian/other Pacific Islander populations experienced decline of 6 percent and 3.5 percent respectively.

University Community. The University community experienced a significant increase in total population of 9.77 percent or 2,976 persons between 1990 and 2000. The community became more racially and ethnically diverse as well. The white population declined by just over 1,000 persons or 4 percent. The non-white population increased significantly. Black/African American population accounted for 2,100 persons, an increase of 121 percent over 1990. The Hispanic/Latino population increased by 97 percent or 650 persons.

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




Calhoun-Isles Community Population Percent Change 1990 - 2000





Camden Community Population Percent Change 1990 - 2000





Central Community Population Percent Change 1990 - 2000






Longfellow Community Population Percent Change 1990 - 2000






Near-North Community Population Percent Change 1990 - 2000





Nokomis Community Population Percent Change 1990 - 2000






Northeast Community Population Percent Change 1990 - 2000






Phillips Community Population Percent Change 1990 - 2000






Powderhorn Community Population Percent Change 1990 - 2000





Southwest Community Population Percent Change 1990 - 2000




