

Planning for profitability: A free workshop to help your restaurant financially plan for minimum wage increases in Minneapolis

Are you a restaurant that needs help planning for and complying with the new minimum wage?

The Minneapolis Minimum Wage Ordinance requires businesses to pay their employees a living wage, gradually increasing from \$9.25 in 2017 to \$15 by 2024. We know this change might require small businesses to restructure their budgets, so the City is hosting a free, interactive session to help business owners understand rising costs and build a financial plan to support them.

In this session, you will learn how to:

- Plan for the wage increases and look for ways to offset additional costs
- Explore the possibility of implementing additional revenue sources
- Learn how to creatively and efficiently schedule labor
- Build a financial model to support paying minimum wages
- Get connected to free, one-on-one financial consulting through the City of Minneapolis
