ANNOUNCEMENT OF Internship Opportunity

Student Intern, Youth Violence Prevention

Minneapolis Youth Violence Intervention Program (MYVIP)

Spring Semester, January 2013- May 2013

Background and Project:

Internship or Field placement opportunity is available with the Minneapolis Department of Health and Family Support (MDHFS). This is an unpaid internship for 15 hours/week that requires the student to collaborate with the MDHFS Youth Violence Prevention Team and Minneapolis's local hospital administrators and social work departments. The scope of this project is to implement the Minneapolis Youth Violence Intervention Program (MYVIP) in collaboration with hospitals. MYVIP is a coordinated youth violence hospital protocol that has been designed to respond to trauma cases that present in the Emergency Department. These cases include youth that have been involved in gang related violence and/or peer-to-peer violence.

Key Partners include Community Based Organizations that will address the needs of each patient. These needs are assessed by the Hospital Social Worker in three tiers: 1. Basic Needs; 2. Trauma Crisis Support; 3. Mental Health/Professional Counseling.

Assignment Responsibilities:

- Meet and connect with Administrators at MDHFS and Partner Hospitals/Social Work Departments and community based agencies
- Coordinate and continue enhance the project by organizing in-service trainings for staff and promote buy-in with partners
- Develop and formalize MYVIP, create a Standard Overriding Communication Objective for the project
- Track and evaluate the impact of MYVIP by collecting program data

Learning Objectives:

- Apply critical thinking skills within context of professional public policy, social work, or public health practice with a community/administrative focus
- Promote student/patient/community/institutional understanding, affirmation, and respect for people from diverse backgrounds: age, class, color, culture, disability, ethnicity, family structure, gender, marital status, national origin, race, religion, sex, and sexual orientation
- Apply the knowledge and skills of policy/administrative/community social work practice with systems based approach
- Analyze, formulate, and understand mechanisms of influence when responding to organizational policies and procedures
- Use communication skills differentially across client populations, colleagues, and communities
- Use supervision and consultation appropriate to public policy, social work, or public health practice
- Function within the structure of organizations and service delivery systems

Knowledge and Skills Preferred:

- Knowledge and interest related to violence prevention, systems thinking, and project development
- Strong skills and experience in managing time well and building relationships to move project forward
- Strong analytic skills and ability to synthesize various sources of information
- Ability to present information and ideas accurately, effectively, and concisely for a variety of audiences
- Experience working with community residents and organizations, especially low-income populations and communities of color
- Knowledge and familiarity with diverse cultures, beliefs and lifestyles
- Ability to work in an environment which requires flexibility, responsiveness, and multi-tasking
- Excellent written and verbal communication skills
- Proficient skill set in all MS Office Applications, including electronic communication
- Current graduate student studying Public Policy, Social Work, Public Health or related field; dual degree students are encouraged to apply
