The Public Works Department


The Department of Public Works is a multi-functional agency providing a variety of maintenance, infrastructure and general services to the residents and business establishments of the community.

The department employs more than 911 full-time personnel and has an annual core services budget of about \$306 million for the operation of its eight divisions:

- *Public Works Administration
- *Solid Waste & Recycling
- *Water Treatment & Distribution
- *Traffic & Parking Services
- *Fleet Services
- *Transportation Planning & Engineering
- *Transportation Maintenance & Repair
- *Surface Water & Sewers

Minneapolis Water Treatment & Distribution Services

Minneapolis Water Treatment & Distribution Services, also known as Minneapolis Water Works, was established in 1867 as a community-wide source of water used for fire fighting. Since then, our system has developed from a single pump station, taking water from the Mississippi River and delivering it to a small distribution system, to the largest water utility in the upper Midwest, with approximately one thousand miles of water main, 14,000 valves and 8,000 fire hydrants within the City of Minneapolis.

The sole source of our water supply is the Mississippi River, with an annual withdrawal of 21 billion gallons. The water we take in from the river goes through a treatment process, including filtration, disinfection and **Columbia Heights Membrane Filtration Plant**



sedimentation. Fluoride is also added to our tap water to help prevent tooth decay.

In addition to treating the water, Minneapolis is one of the few cities in Minnesota that softens water at a centralized softening plant, which saves our customers the expense of buying and maintaining their own home softening system.

In 2005, a state-of-the-art Membrane Filtration Plant was built, which effectively removes impurities smaller than can be detected by a standard microscope. This system removes impurities even more effectively than required by emerging and increasingly stringent federal drinking water standards.

Minneapolis Water Treatment & Distribution Services produces an average of 50 million gallons of safe, great-tasting economical tap water each day.

- Assist in management and oversight of the operation of the water treatment plants and distribution system.
- Provide direction for the maintenance, design and construction of water treatment plants and the distribution systems.
- Assist in administering multi-million dollar budgets and long-term financial plans for all Water Department activities.
- Aid in the management of the Department, including establishing policies, goals, objectives and performance measures.
- Provide leadership to achieve the goals of cost effective water production and distribution, excellent water quality, and good customer service.
- Develop strategies to accomplish the mission of the City and Department.
- Assist in the management of suburban and other external customer contracts for the supply of water.
- Act in response to queries, requests and complaints from the Mayor, City Council members and other City staff, and promote customer and stakeholder relationships.
- Represent the City on various internal and external boards and committees.
- Act as a media contact on water supply, treatment and operation concerns, etc. including consumer confidence reports, press releases and interviews.
- Help with initiating change within the Water Treatment and Distribution Services Division that promotes a high performing team and supports Public Works in meeting the goals of the City, and its citizens.
- Assist in management and oversight of the personnel and administrative issues for the Water Treatment and Distribution Department, including recruitment and retention of diverse workforce, training, performance management, engagement, and employee relations.

The Position

The Assistant Director Water Treatment and Distribution will report to the Director of Water Treatment and Distribution and work closely with the Director of Public Works, other Division Directors and City Departments for which services are provided.

In addition, this position works closely with MN Department of Health , neighboring cities and the Metropolitan Council.

The position administers an annual budget of more than \$70 million and oversees the management of about 197 full-time employees.
