Berry cartons (paper only)	Automobile and engine fluids (antifreeze, motor oil, etc.)
Bones	Baby, personal and flushable moist wipes
Candy (remove from wrapper)	Band-Aids™, bandages and first-aid items
Cellulose sponges	Batteries
Cereal	Candles and candle wax
Certified compostable bags (must be labeled BPI Certified Compostable)	Candy and chip wrappers
Certified compostable food-service items (must be labeled BPI or Cedar Grove Certified Compostable)	Cartons (soup, broth, milk, juice, or wine)
Cheese	Cat litter
Chopsticks (wood only)	Ceramics (mugs, plates, bowls, vases, etc.)
Coffee filters	Cigarettes and butts
Coffee grounds	Cigars and butts
Condiment packets (paper only including: salt, pepper, sugar, sugar substitute, etc.)	Cleaning products including towels, rags, sponges, etc. soaked with cleaning products
Cork (natural only)	Condiment packets (plastic and foil including: ketchup, relish, red pepper, parmesan, taco sauce, etc.)
Corn cobs, husks and shuckings	Condoms and related products
Cotton balls (without chemicals on them)	Construction materials (concrete, sheetrock, etc.)
100% cotton or wool clothing that cannot be repaired or donated (cut into 4" x 4" pieces)	Containers (plastic, glass metal)
Dough	Cosmetics and perfumes
Dryer lint	Crayons and chalk
Dust bunnies	Dead animals
Egg cartons (paper only)	Dental floss
Egg shells	Detergents (liquid, powder, sheets, and tablets)
Facial tissue	Diapers (baby, overnight, training, swim, and covers)
Fish and fish parts	Dusting wipes
Food - ALL spoiled, moldy, frozen food, dairy, frozen dairy, all fruits and vegetables including peelings and pits, baked goods, sauces, herbs and spices, nuts, seafood and fish including shells and parts, meat including fat and bones, etc.	Feces (human and pet)
Flower bouquets (remove ribbon and plastic)	Feminine hygiene products (tampons, pads, liners, applicators - paper or plastic)
Fondue	Fertilizers (solid and liquid)
Frozen foods	Foil and foil-type bags (chips, candy)
Fruit, fruit peels, fruit seeds and pits	Garden trimmings and waste*
Fur - from pet grooming (not fur clothing)	Gauze
Grains	Glass
Gravy and sauces	Grass clippings*
Hair - human and pet	Gum
Herbs and Spices	Incontinence products

Microwaveable paper packaging (no plastic or foil lining)	Metal
Nail clippings	Microwaveable popcorn bags (plastic lined with BPA)
Newspaper that is wet with food or dirt	Packing peanuts (foam or "degradable")
Noodles	Paper than can be recycled
Nuts and nut shells	Personal hygiene products (toothpaste, soap, etc.)
Oatmeal	Pesticides (soild and liquids)
Oysters	Pet food bags (plastic or foil lined)
Paper bags (flour, sugar, cornmeal that are not plastic lined)	Pet waste and waste handling items
Paper take-out containers (not plastic lined or if lined they must be labeled BPI or Cedar Grove certified compostable) (remove any metal)	Photos and slides
Paper plates and cups ( unlined or if lined they must be labeled BPI or Cedar Grove certified compostable)	Plastic (all non-certified compostable)
Paper soiled with food	Plastic flim (bags and wrap)
Paper towels and napkins	Popcorn bags that go in the microwave
Pastries and pies	Plastic lined paper (unless is BPI or Cedar Grove certified compsoatable)
Parchment paper	Q-tips™ with plastic middle
Pencils (no metal, foil or erasers)	Remodeling debris
Pencil shavings	Rocks and gravel
Pet food and treats (dry, wet - strain liquids first)	Rubber and rubber bands
Pickles	Sandwich bags (unless are BPI or Cedar Grove certified compostable)
Pizza boxes	Soap (liquid, bar, shampoo, dish, dishwasher, laundry)
PLA plastic (only if labeled BPI or Cedar Grove certified compostable)	Soil and dirt
Popcorn kernels	Star Tribune "oxy degradable" bags
Popcsicle sticks and toothpicks (wood only)	Styrofoam™ and peanuts
Q-tips™ (cardboard middle only)	Synthetic clothing
Sawdust (untreated wood only) (no metal)	Tape (transparent, Scotch™, electrical, duct, packing, mounting, clear, gift wrap, etc.)
Spices (fresh or dried)	Toys
Soup (strain liquids down drain first)	Treated wood (lumber and sawdust)
Tea bags (tea bag packaging must be paper only, no plastic or foil lining) (remove staples)	Vacuum cleaner bags
Tissues and tissue paper	Wax
Vacuum cleaner contents (no metal, platstic, or pet litter)	Wood scraps
Wax paper (butter wraps, pastry bags, fast food wappers, etc.)	<b>Note:</b> Items marked with a * in the No column are great to compost in a backyard compost bin.
