

Scope

- What?
 - Reconstruction of Riverside Avenue, Entire Right of Way, meaning:
 - Sidewalks, Street, Storm Water, Streetscape will all be rebuilt
- Where?
 - From Cedar Avenue to Franklin Avenue, but not including the intersections
- When?
 - Currently scheduled for 2011 and 2012





Process

- Met with individual property owners
- Review consultant information to inform design – Kimley Horn
- Create preliminary recommendations
- Held initial Neighborhood meeting for review of layout (June 22)
- Make revisions to layout (June – August 2010)
- Return to Neighborhoods for further consultation (August 23)
- Finalize layout (August/September 2010)
- Present layout for City Council approval (September/October 2010)
- Forward to MnDOT for State approval of layout (Complete by 12/31)
- Enter Final Design Phase
- Hold Neighborhood meeting to discuss construction phasing and impacts
- City Council hearing to consider assessments




Main Input Received to Date:

- Bike Lanes should continue through the intersection with Cedar Avenue

Proposal

- Bicycle lanes the entire length of the corridor





Main Input Received to Date:

- Retain parking wherever it is possible
- Parking not a major concern when considering other demands for space
