The City wants to partner with residents, neighborhood associations and local businesses to help make our neighborhoods a safe and clean place to live. Starting June 9th, inspectors from the Department of Regulatory services will be going out into your neighborhood, with a special focus on vacant properties or properties with repeated nuisance violations. Let's work together to make our community a better place to live!

Below are some of the most common violations our staff is on the lookout for:



Tall grass and weeds shall be maintained and kept under eight inches. Contractors may mow yards that have not been taken care of in a timely manner.



Inoperable vehicles may not be stored on residential property. This includes vehicles with flat tires and expired tabs. Vehicles in violation may be towed.



Vegetation shall not overhang the sidewalk, alley, or street. An overhead clearance of 7' for sidewalks and 14' for alleys and streets shall be maintained. Contractors will trim overhanging branches.



Yards shall be kept free of **garbage, litter, and junk**. Property upkeep shows that people care about the neighborhood. Contractors may remove excess trash and debris.



Brush and branches attract rodents, are a fire hazard, may not be stored in yards, and must be bundled for pickup. Contractors will remove brush that has not been disposed of properly.
