

Minnesota laws require the public release of body worn camera video from the critical incident that occurred on May 30th within 14 days of the incident, unless there is a determination that the public release of the body worn camera video would interfere with an ongoing criminal investigation.

The Minnesota Bureau of Criminal Apprehension (BCA) is investigating this incident and has requested that MPD temporarily withhold the body worn camera video because publicly releasing it may interfere with its investigation. Therefore, in reliance on the BCA’s request, I have made the determination that body worn camera video from this incident will not be publicly released at this time because doing so will interfere with the ongoing investigation. I pledge the MPD’s full cooperation with the BCA’s investigation, and I don’t anticipate a significant delay in the public release of the body-worn camera video.
