

Crosswalk guidelines for unsignalized intersections

Information on unsignalized intersections

Overview

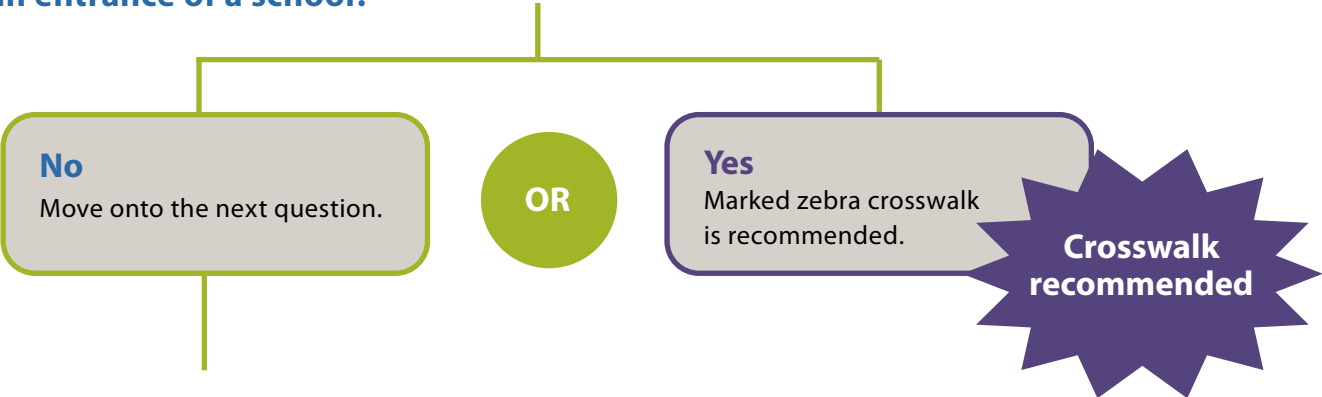
Minneapolis Public Works uses a standard process to decide if a crosswalk should be marked.

The process looks at factors such as how many vehicles and people use an intersection. Public Works may mark a crosswalk where traffic and walking activity are at a moderate level.

At locations with higher traffic, Public Works may add extra safety treatments. If it is unclear how many people are walking in an area, Public Works may conduct a count.

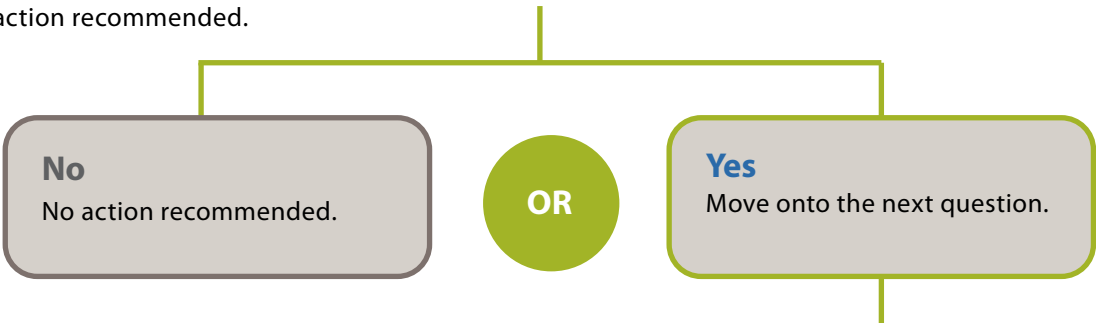
Want to request a crosswalk in your community? Review the questionnaire below to learn more.

1. Is it a school-patrolled crossing or nearest intersection to the main entrance of a school?



2. Does the major street have 3,000 vehicles per day or more?

3a. Does it have at least 3 legs on the Pedestrian Priority Network and is all-way stop controlled?

3b. Is it a location where a school route or a Walking Route For Youth crosses the major street within 1,250 feet of a school?

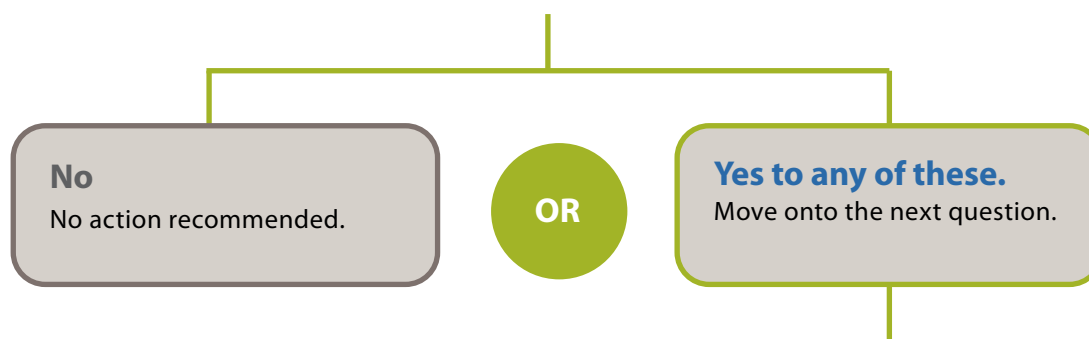
3c. Is it adjacent to an entry point for a park and the nearest walking route to a high pedestrian generating amenity?

Example a large playground, pool or rec center, etc.

3d. Is it a location where a dedicated bikeway or shared use path crosses the major street?

3e. Is there a pedestrian generator (such as a coffee shop, restaurant, etc)?

Pedestrian volumes may be required to verify pedestrian activities.

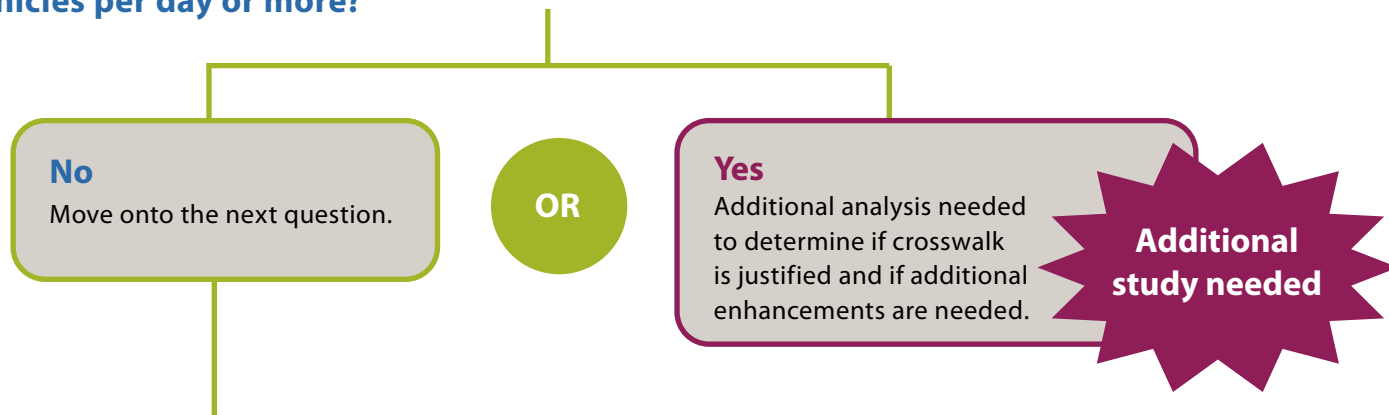

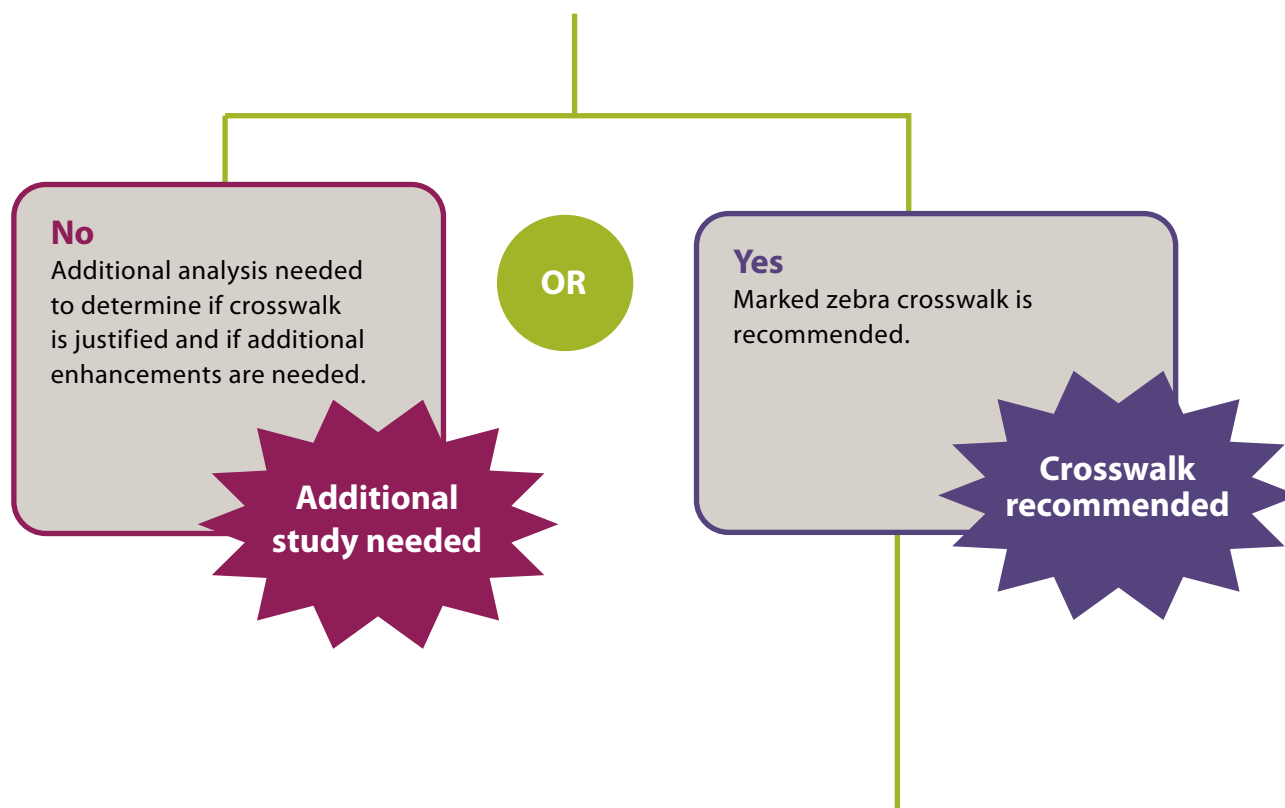

4. Is there more than 1 vehicle lane per direction? Or does the major street have 8,000 vehicles per day or more?



5. Is the nearest marked crosswalk or traffic signal more than 500 feet away?
