**When it snows,
remember to
shovel your sidewalk**



It's the law, and it's the neighborly thing to do.

Sidewalks are an important part of Minneapolis' transportation system, and they should be open for everyone. That's why Minneapolis ordinance requires property owners to clear sidewalks within 24 hours after a snowfall for houses and duplexes and four daytime hours for all other properties. If your walk is not cleared, the City could have it cleared and you would be billed.

There may be resources for people who need help clearing their sidewalks. People can call 311 for a list of resources that might be available.

Don't forget your garbage, recycling and organics carts



Shovel a 36-inch-wide path from your carts to the alley or street within 24 hours after the snow stops falling, or by your next collection day.

If City crews have to shovel them out, a \$30 fee per cart will be added to your utility bill.
