Use Less Salt



Salt is toxic to our local freshwater wildlife.

When snow and ice melt, salt travels through storm drains, into our lakes and the Mississippi River, permanently polluting our waterways.



More salt does not mean more melting!

What Can I Do?

- Shovel and scrape snow promptly to avoid using salt and to prevent icy spots
- Sand can be used for traction on top of ice
- **Scatter** salt lightly only where needed. Aim for 3 inches of space between salt grains
- **Reduce** use. Salt only goes on icy spots. Do not put salt on bare pavement that has no ice
- **Sweep** up and reuse leftover salt after ice melts. Leftover salt is a sign of over salting
